

Articulation Agreement
Southern New Hampshire University
and
Timberlane Regional High School

Southern New Hampshire University (SNHU) and Timberlane Regional High School (TRHS), in the spirit of building a financial bridge between TRHS seniors and SNHU, hereby do enter into an admission articulation scholarship agreement.

This Articulation Agreement made this 8th day of SEPTEMBER, 2011, by and between Southern New Hampshire University and Timberlane Regional High School includes the following benefits:

1. Southern New Hampshire University will grant a \$2,000 admission articulation scholarship to qualified students who submit a completed application for admission by February 1, 2012. Admission decisions will be made within 30 days. This scholarship will be in addition to any go-getter or academic scholarships received (outlined below).
2. Southern New Hampshire University awards academic go-getter grants and academic scholarships up to \$18,000/year to qualified applicants. Scholarship dollars amounts are calculated by the student's GPA, ACT/SAT scores (if provided) and curriculum at the conclusion of first, quarter senior year. Students are encouraged to take the most challenging level of core courses that they can be successful in. Southern New Hampshire University requires admission candidates to complete 16 college prep courses including four years of English, three or more years of mathematics, two or more years of science and two or more years of social science. Scholarships are available to:

Qualified applicants with GPA's of 2.5 - 2.99 may qualify for academic go-getter grants between \$2,000 and \$9,000

Qualified applicants with GPA's of 3.0 - 3.49 may qualify for academic scholarships between \$7,000 and \$14,000

Qualified applicants with GPA's greater than 3.5 may qualify for the Presidential Scholarship between \$11,000 and \$15,000

Additional scholarships available for DECA, FBLA, Sibling Grant, Alumni, SkillsUSA and Academy of Finance

3. SNHU is a test optional school. Students who do take the ACT or SAT are encouraged to submit their test scores, as high scores (above a 1,000 for critical reading and math) may help in securing a larger academic scholarship.

4. Waived \$40 application fee.
5. Choice between commuting or residing on campus.
6. Non-binding acceptance to SNHU that allows seniors to continue to make final enrollment decisions before May 1.
7. Possible college credit for the successful completion of Running Start, AP or IB courses taken during high school.
8. Articulation scholarships and academic go-getter grants and scholarships are renewable all four years at SNHU provided a student meet satisfactory academic progress at the college level as outlined by their specific award.
9. Additional financial aid consideration if a student completes the FAFSA form by the priority deadline of March 15th.
10. The Admission Scholarship Agreement will be reviewed and renewed on an annual basis with TRHS.
